### Intro

Welcome to the Agrobiodiversity Summer School 2022 participant brochure! Here you will find all the information you need to prepare you for our course together.

In this Summer School, you will learn about the contribution of various aspects of agrobiodiversity to the sustainability and resilience of food systems. We will be learning and working in plenary, as well as in small, international groups and in collaboration with local stakeholders. After this course, you will be able to identify different aspects of agrobiodiversity, describe the impact of ecological, economic, social and political aspects and drivers of agrobiodiversity and to develop innovative, creative and scientifically sound solutions for designing locally adapted and resilient land use systems through improving their agrobiodiversity. So you see, you will have much to discover during our 10 days together!

On the 31<sup>st</sup> of August 2021, we will kick off our time together in the beautiful city of *Santiago de Compostela*, where we will be based for the first part of the Summer School (31.08. - 03.09.22). Our sleeping accommodation is located at Residencia Universitaria Burgo das Nacións (<a href="https://www.usc.es/en/servizos/sur/residencias/burgo/">https://www.usc.es/en/servizos/sur/residencias/burgo/</a>). For the studying part we will be based in the Fontán building, in the City of Culture of Galicia, where the Interuniversity Research Center in Cultural Atlantic Landscapes (CISPAC) is located (<a href="https://cispac.gal/en/home/">https://cispac.gal/en/home/</a>). There will be a bus taking us from one accommodation to the other.

For the second part of the Summer School (04.09. - 07.09.21) we will transfer to the town of *Ribadeo*, before travelling back to Santiago for the last three days of the course. In Ribadeo we will stay at the Pedro Murias Farm, an old agrarian school founded with money from Cuban emigration in the early twentieth century.

In our Summer School group, we will speak English and we ask you to stick to this as well to make sure everyone is included in the conversations. During the excursions we will often meet local actors who are not necessarily proficient in English. In this case, there is always someone who will translate to English.

From the 1st until the 10th of September breakfast, lunch, dinner and some snacks will be provided (no dinner on the 10<sup>th</sup>).

### Galicia Tips

In the following you can find some information about Galician customs:

- ! If you have any kind of emergency in Spain, you can call 112 (even with a foreign SIM card). This will connect you with the police centre, they will guide you to the appropriate service.
- ! In Spain we use Euros, you will most probably not be able to pay with other currencies. Most places have card readers, but in some cases, only cash is possible.
- ! In Spain plugs are type J, the standard voltage is 230V and the standard frequency is 50Hz, so you might need to bring an adapter.
- ! Galicia has two official languages: Spanish and Galician. Most people know English, especially in a travelling context.



## Mini Case Study Presentations

You will have the opportunity to present your mini case study (MCS) to the other participants and the coaches during the Summer School. For this we asked you to produce a poster because presenting your research to the general public is a relevant skill for young researchers and professionals. Below you can find your time slot (10 minutes each) – they have been assigned randomly. Your presentation should be 5 minutes long and is followed by a discussion of at least 5 minutes, where the other participants can ask you questions. For your presentation you should use only the poster and no additional power point presentation.

#### For the poster presentation you should consider the following:

- You have 5 minutes for your presentation. Prepare an oral summary that has a clear story line and
  highlights the main points of your MCS practice sticking to the time limit! During the presentation,
  point to the relevant parts of your poster so the audience knows where to find more information
  later.
- You will have another 5 minutes for questions and answers. Make sure you are ready to answer
  possible questions confidently and know how to deal with difficult questions that you may not be able
  to answer fully.
- Although some of you might need to reduce the information on the poster, others may even need to add to the amount of information. However, for your poster presentation, please focus on the most important message you want to communicate based on your mini case study.
- Please keep in mind that posters also function as an instrument to inspire discussion of your work with other interested people.

#### Here are a few additional tips for the poster presentation:

- Follow a storyline (red thread) and use transitions between sections.
- Turn to the audience and make eye contact.
- Stand in a good place in relation to your poster, you can also change your position during the presentation.
- Stand on both feet, relax and do not move too much.
- It is better to point with your hand to illustrations/parts of your poster than to use a laser pointer.
- Give take-home messages, do not present the whole project.
- Be prepared to answer questions.

The coaches will evaluate your presentation, and you will have the chance to clarify any feedback questions you might have in the evenings.
